Raspberry Ranch Review

An IWF of Idaho weekend at Raspberry Ranch, Cascade
June 21-23, 2019

We all gathered at Remington's, a surprisingly excellent restaurant with a sophisticated menu in Cascade, Idaho, a community of 902 people.



Carol MacGregor hosted 9 IWF members at her ranch, four miles south of Cascade, looking north over Cascade Lake, and nested under West Mountain. Her home, a New Mexico Territorial style stucco, has verdant views; her cows were clearly enjoying eating!





We drove on trails she called roads, through land she acquired from her father, onto land she bought to enhance acreage. She explained how water rights work on her ranch, showing us several diversions.

Then we drove through bumps onto a sandy shore of the North Fork of the Payette River, where we disembarked to watch its flow, much changed from six decades ago, where she swam as a young woman. Carol explained how her father, Gordon MacGregor and Pablo Aramburu pioneered a system of irrigation in 1946 from West Mountain that still works well. She is the current "Ditch Master."

Our next lesson was timber. We maneuvered though pot holes, sped through mud, and cranked around hairpin turns to see examples of forest restored to include spacious grasslands between healthy timber, young and old. Carol's crew had obliterated the dead and dying trees and balanced species left unbalanced by previous logging. She showed us the firebreak she made adjacent to the US Forest Service land.



We returned to the ranch for lunch and afternoon discussion by members. The key theme was leadership qualities members deployed to succeed in traditionally male enterprises. Carol began the discussion session with a beautifully scripted paper from Evelyn Johnson about her military experience; Kay Hardy shared her story about her trout farming business on the Snake River and its complex intersection with water rights adjudication;



and Gloria Totoricagüena discussed how building her experience and credentials has advanced her success as a lobbyist.



All members then contributed their personal experience to the afternoon's work-session.

We all shared a delicious dinner together at Carol's ranch overlooking Cascade Lake.

We are very grateful to Dr. Carol MacGregor for her hospitality and the amazing opportunity to learn from her and each other.
