IWF Idaho Member Janet Gallimore Received the Western Museum Association's Leadership Award



On October 5, 2019, IWF Idaho Member Janet L. Gallimore, Executive Director of the Idaho State Historical Society was awarded the *Leadership Award* by the Western Museums Association. The Leadership Award recognizes and

acknowledges outstanding lifetime achievement in museums and/or a museum-related field. The Award is presented at the WMA Annual Meeting to a museum professional with more than 20 years in the field whose career has had a sustained, considerable, and lasting impact on museum practices and/or the museum profession in the Western Region.

Ms. Gallimore directs a dynamic state agency comprised of the Idaho State Museum, Idaho State Archives and State Records Center, State Historic Preservation Office, and Historic Sites program. Ms. Gallimore has 35 years' experience in the area of cultural resource management. She holds an MS in Business from National Lewis University and BA in Business and Fine Art from Barat College. Ms. Gallimore has been the Executive Director of the Idaho State Historical Society since 2007 and has served in a leadership role for a range of vital state initiatives including the restoration of the Idaho State Capitol, the yearlong commemoration of the State Territorial Sesquicentennial, and the creation of the A. Lincoln: His Legacy in Idaho exhibition at the Idaho State Archives, and, most recently, the reimagining and opening of the new Idaho State Museum. She also serves on the Idaho Capitol Commission. A graduate of the J. Paul Getty Museum Management Institute, Ms. Gallimore is currently a member of the Board of the International Women's Forum of Idaho and a member of the Steering Committee for the History Relevance Campaign. She has served as a peer reviewer for American Alliance of Museums (AAM) and its museum accreditation program since 1995. Ms. Gallimore was awarded the 2018 Idaho Humanities Council Outstanding Achievement in the Humanities; the *Idaho Women of the Year* by the Idaho Business Review in 2010 and 2019; and the CEO of Influence by the Idaho Business Review in 2018.


