

Prior to serving in the Idaho Legislature, Jaquet was the Executive Director of the Sun Valley-Ketchum Chamber of Commerce during a period of membership and financial success. Jaquet currently serves on the Idaho Board of Health and Welfare, the Andrus Policy Center, the Common Sense American Idaho Advisory Committee and the College of Southern Idaho Hailey advisory board. Staying Connected through Literature

Alongside efforts to keep our IWF Idaho community together via Virtual Events, Vice President Peggy Goldwyn had the wonderful idea of sharing book reviews and recommendations in our monthly newsletters.

A Review of Writers and Lovers by Lily King submitted by Julie Weston

A young Casey Peabody (31 years) has been working on a novel for six years while she moved from place to place. She ends up near Boston

and, following her mother's death, struggles to complete the novel, support herself as a waitress, and recover from the end of a love affair. When she falls in love with two different men, both writers, her situation becomes even more complex. This book reflects the ups and downs of writing amidst all the interruptions life brings along. Sometimes maddening, sometimes poignant, Casey's story kept this reader interested and empathetic, especially because, I, too, am a writer, and felt the angst Casey experiences as replicative of some of my own. Digging to find her own creativity and inspiration in both banal and brilliant emotions, Casey recovers from her grief and, with humor and dawning wisdom and courage, finishes her novel and discovers lasting love. She also finds a publisher!
