

## 2020 IWF Idaho Annual Meeting

"The IWF of Idaho membership met virtually for its 2020 annual meeting on Saturday August 1. 36 members attended and considered and elected 2 new at large board members, including Cathy Silak and Gloria Totoricagüena and officers including Janet Gallimore, Peggy Goldwyn and Randi McDermott. Members also had the opportunity to chart the direction of the next two years of IWF through breaks out discussions. Priorities from these discussions included continued strong programming, the development of a mentorship program, and a focus on understanding Idaho issues surrounding Diversity Equity Access and Inclusion. The board will discuss and include members' suggestions and incorporate those into the IWF of Idaho Strategic Initiative 2020 Framework. I am ever so grateful for our Officers, Committee Chairs, and Board members for their devotion to IWF of Idaho, its mission and each other. Our pivot to digital programming, under the leadership of Program Committee, has been extraordinarily well received. The membership explored the

history of Women's Suffrage in Idaho and Idaho's role in the passage of the 19<sup>th</sup> amendment through a virtual presentation. IWF Idaho Vice President, Peggy Goldwyn



Peggy Elliot Goldwyn wrote television comedies for many years, including "That Girl" and "Happy Days", as well as television movies and motion pictures. One of her many scripts for "The Odd Couple" was named one of the top 100 situation comedy scripts by The Writers' Guild of America. She was Vice President of the Samuel Goldwyn Company, a film company, from 1986 to 2003. As a volunteer, she has made documentaries for UNHCR and Planned Parenthood. Her first novel, A Small Part of History", about women on the Oregon Trail in 1846, was published in 2008. She has been a Board Member of Friends of UNFPA (The United Nations agency for reproductive health and the rights of women) since 2006, and founded The Family of Woman Film Festival in Sun Valley, Idaho in 2008 to support their work. and advocate for women's equality. She is also a Commissioner of the Women's Refugee Commission. She serves on the Board of the Andrus Center for Public Policy at Boise State University. She is a founding member of IWF-Idaho and received the IWF National Women Who Make a Difference award in 2015.
