First, I would like to invite all of you to The Trailing of the Sheep Festival, celebrating its 25th anniversary this October. We are hosting renown author. essayist and friend, Gretel Ehrlich this year. She will be the keynote speaker Friday, October 8th at The Trailing's Sheep Tales Gathering. The gathering is at 7:00pm at the Argyros Theater. That evening, Gretel will share the stories of her travels and her deeply personal concern for friends and people throughout the world who are losing their traditional connections to the land through climate chaos. These revealing and intimate experiences fill her new book "Unsolaced: Along the Way to All That Is" which I highly recommend to all of you. Throughout its pages she travels from the Arctic to Zimbabwe and more. Intently, she listens to stories in threatened communities and walks disappearing landscapes thriving only several years earlier. She spends time with friends and experts charting ice flows in Greenland and seeking innovative ideas on grazing practices with Africa's Allan Savory. She is determined to understand what's at stake for the future. Gretel's first awareness of the beauty and complexities of our changing world began during her early days cowboying in Wyoming. She wrote about these issues in her first book published in 1985, "The Solace of Open Spaces. Since then, she has gone on to write over 13 books about the environment and our place in it. Her new book "Unsolaced: Along the way to All that Is" has been called a bookend to her first publication. I hope you will have time to read it and join us on October 8. That evening she will read from this book and also be in conversation on these issues with Jenny Davidson, Executive Director of the Community Library.

Each year, several ranchers in the Sun Valley region send their herds north to graze in the mountains during the summer. For 25 years, The Trailing of the Sheep Festival has celebrated the return of the herds to their winter home. Founded by rancher John Peavey and his wife Diane, author and IWF-Idaho member, the Festival culminates with the sheep parading their way south via Main Street in Ketchum. Beforehand, Basque, Scottish and Peruvian sheepherding heritages have been celebrated through cultural events, sheepdog trials have been held, and cooking classes and lamb tastings have been offered. The Trailing of the Sheep Festival has been named by numerous travel magazines as one of the top regional events in the US. For a full schedule of events,

Member Spotlight

Diane Peavey



Diane Josephy Peavey left life in Washington, D.C. to marry into a third (now fifth) generation Idaho sheep and cattle ranch. In Washington, she worked for Time Magazine, in Congress and at several federal agencies. In Idaho she began to write stories of the land, its history, people and the changing landscapes of the American West. Many of these aired weekly for 18 years on Idaho Public Radio and are collected in her book Bitterbrush Country: Living on the Edge of the Land. Her writings have also appeared in numerous western magazines, journals and anthologies and her librettos on Lewis and Clark and the Nez Perce Indians have been performed throughout the region. She has been a speaker at Stegner Lecturer for the Peninsula Open Space Trust and a guest poet at the National Cowboy Poetry Gathering among other events. She and her husband, John, co-founded the Idaho Trailing of the Sheep Festival 23 years ago. This was named by National Geographic one of the seven best fall Festivals in the United States in 2019. She directed it through its early years and now serves on its Advisory Committee. She is also on the Idaho Humanities Council's Speakers' Bureau, the Boards of the Idaho Center of the Book and the national American Lamb Board.
