Kay Hardy

IWF Idaho member Kay Hardy received the Lifetime Achievement in the Arts Award at the 2020 Governor's Awards in the Arts, presented on November 9th. The biennial awards, established in 1970 by the Idaho Commission on the Arts, bring recognition to Idaho's

exceptional artists, arts organizations, and arts supporters. Awardees are Idaho residents who have made significant contributions to the cultural life of Idaho and to the arts, through their creative accomplishments or distinguished service. Since 1970, the Lifetime Achievement Awards in the Arts have been presented only nine times - the last of which was in 2014. As a small business owner and President of both Idaho Trout Company and Hagerman Trout Farms, Kay has worked with agriculture and water issues, including water right adjudication, mediation and successful dispute resolution. Kay is President of The Hardy Foundation, whose mission includes preservation of significant landscapes and historic buildings. She has been actively involved with historic preservation for over 40 years, currently in Utah and Idaho, locally in the preservation of Boise's Egyptian Theatre, and previously in New Mexico as Project Manager for the State Office of Cultural Affairs. In collaboration with The Nature Conservancy, Kay and her family worked to preserve the 350 acre Earl M. Hardy Box Canyon Nature Preserve, site of the 11th largest spring in North America, which is now part of the Idaho State Park system. Kay is currently a Conservancy Board member. Kay serves on numerous community Boards in executive and advisory positions, primarily in the visual and performing arts. As a former ceramist, she later collected modern and contemporary ceramics, many gifted to the Boise Art Museum. Kay holds a B.A. in English Literature and a Master of Architecture with honors.
