The book club decided to meet again on Thursday, January 13th, to discuss the latest book by Nobel Prize winner Mario Vargas Llosa. *Harsh Times* is "a story of international conspiracies and conflicting interests in the time of the Cold War, echoes of which still reverberate today...vivid characters go to the heart of the

dilemmas of Guatemala's history in a deeply textured blending of fact and fiction that is his [Llosa's] alone." Well, maybe not his alone. The December book club discussed how Isabelle Allende, in *The Long Petal of the Sea*, combines history and fiction in such a compelling way. In fact, this book so resonated with our current refugee crises and political furor that Jennifer made note of a section to share: "Chile is divided into irreconcilable groups, son. Friends are fighting, families are split down the middle; it's impossible to talk to anyone who doesn't think as you do. I don't see many of my old friends anymore so that we won't fight."

Carol Nie

Sun Valley IWF Board Member, Carol Nie, has been elected President of the Ketchum-based Spur Community Foundation.

Spur was founded five years ago "to inspire effective philanthropy for the Wood River Valley." Since its founding, the organization has distributed 4.5 million dollars, as well as providing ongoing nonprofit assessments, nonprofit consulting services, and coaching programs for local nonprofit executive directors and board chairs. Carol has served as a member of Spur's board of directors since 2016 and is chair of the foundation's grants committee.

"I am honored to lead this amazing organization, which in only five years has had a significant impact on our nonprofit community in the Wood River Valley," Carol said. "Spur has the ability to be nimble in responding to urgent local issues. For example, as the pandemic shut down schools and after-school activities and all learning became remote, it became clear many children from underserved communities were severely handicapped in their ability to gain benefit from online classes and activities. Spur organized a telephone conference of organizational directors in the education space, which resulted in numerous collaborations to improve services provided to this population. The conference also resulted in a published list of all organizations which offer activities, tutors, counseling services, etc."

Carol has had a long history of service in The Wood River Valley. She was a founding member of the Wood River Women's Foundation, served as board chair of the Sun Valley Music Festival for eight years, founded the Festival Music Institute, and was instrumental in the development of the Sun Valley Pavilion.

Carol received her undergraduate degree from Washington University in St. Louis,

her hometown, and her MBA from the University of Chicago Booth School of Business.
