<u>Special Presentation on the Idaho Women's Suffrage Commemorative</u> <u>Sculpture</u>

What: Special Presentation on the Idaho Women's Suffrage Commemorative Sculpture

When: Tuesday, December 6th at 6 p.m.

Where: The Community Library in Ketchum

Join our IWFI President and the Idaho State Historical Society's Executive Director Janet L. Gallimore in a conversation about the journey to create the Idaho Women's Suffrage Commemorative Sculpture.

A legacy of the 2020 Idaho Women 100: Courageous Past, Unlimited Future initiative, commemorating the passage of the 19th Amendment and women's suffrage, this will be the first monument dedicated to women on the Idaho State House grounds.

Irene Deely, the respected Idaho sculptor known for her figurative sculptures in bronze is the project's artist. Inspired in part by the Idaho State Seal, this woman walks metaphorically in the footsteps of those who came before and then hands off her shoe to the future.

The Idaho Capitol Commission approved the sculpture for placement on the Idaho State Capitol grounds and it will become part of the Idaho State Historical Society's collections, in the Capitol Collections portfolio.

In 1896, Idaho was the 4th state to grant its women suffrage through Idaho Senate Resolution 2.

The Idaho Women's Suffrage Commemorative Sculpture reminds all Idahoans of Idaho's

historic leadership as the 4th state to grant women suffrage and the 30th state to ratify the national women's suffrage amendment; these were noble acts of justice by Idaho's elected representatives.

Created though the generosity of private donors, the Foundation for Idaho History championed the fundraising campaign for this piece, which will be dedicated in December of 2022.

COMING FROM THE NORTH:

Take 75 to the left turn for Buttercup Road that is after the Greenhorn light and the Ohio Gulch turn off on the left. There is actually a lone street light on 75 opposite the turn! Follow Buttercup past the Valley Club south entrance and past Indian Creek Road, both on your left. You will then immediately see 2122 on a mailbox on your left - that is NOT the driveway. It is the next driveway with a black 2118 sign (a bit hard to see).

COMING FROM THE SOUTH:

Take 75/Main Street to the light at McKercher Blvd (across from Albertsons, at the north end of Hailey). Take a right on McKercher and go all the way to the top of the Hill. Take a left onto Buttercup. Drive until you see West Meadow Ave on your left (maybe a mile), then

almost immediately on your right, you will see two driveways together. It is the second of the two with a black 2118 address sign. (A bit hard to see).

It is a program developed by a current Fellow, Iryna Rubis, who was a successful entrepreneur in Ukraine and fled with her small children after losing everything. IWF provided her a full scholarship to become a Fellow.

Member Spotlight



Bettina P. Murray, Ph.D.

Bettina P. Murray holds three masters' degrees in curriculum design and language instruction and specialized in language, literacy, and learning for her Ph.D. at Fordham University. She taught in several schools and colleges in New York before joining the faculty of John Jay College of Criminal Justice, City University of New York, in 1996. At John Jay, she teaches in the Communication and Theatre Arts Departments. She researches culturally responsive literature, making pedagogical connections between curriculum and the historical heritage of individuals. She has recently published on the topic of language and adjustment anxieties in the *Journal of Behavioral and Social Science*, and on the use of allegory for cross cultural studies in *Advances in Language and Literary Studies*. Dr. Murray has presented on topics of critical thinking and justice issues and has lectured at conferences in the U.S., Canada, and Europe. Her international presentations have frequently focused on the use of critical thinking strategies with law enforcement personnel.

She established and remains active with international scholarships, including The Jerry McCabe and A. Brean Murray Scholarships at John Jay College. She sat on the board of trustees of The John Jay College Foundation, Inc. from 2002 until 2015, when a classroom was dedicated to her. She also served on the board of trustees of social service organizations, preparatory schools, Dickinson College, and remains active on the board of the New York Foundation for Senior Citizens. She was on an advisory committee for special programs at Columbia University for 30 years, and in 2016 she was the first recipient of the Dean's Service Award from Columbia's School of Professional Studies. In 2019 Dr. Murray received The Distinguished Faculty award from the John Jay College Alumni Association.

Dr. Murray was recognized at ceremonies in Dublin, Ireland at the headquarters for The Irish National Police Force (An Garda Siochana) in 2011, 2014, and 2016.



In November of 2022, she received an award from Commissioner Drew Harris of An Garda Siochana in Dublin, Ireland, where she was honored for her contributions to The Jerry McCabe Scholarship.
