IWF provided her a full scholarship to become a Fellow.

Member Spotlight



Clare Swanger

Clare Swanger's career has focused on land conservation, animal welfare, environment, economy, and human communities. She seeks win-win solutions, and has led numerous early-stage programs and organizations to success and sustainability.

In 2007, Clare founded The Comfortable Canine®, LLC to improve dog behavior and well-being. She specializes in teaching dogs with challenging behavior to live calmly and confidently in our world. Clare's work is grounded in Tellington TTouch® of which she is a Senior Practitioner. In 2019, she taught and presented at the Association of Professional Dog Trainers' national conference, the largest such organization in the U.S.

From 2011-2018, Clare was Program Coordinator for Blaine County Idaho's Land, Water, and Wildlife Program (LWWP), the first county-level, taxpayer-funded conservation program in the state. The Idaho Chapter of the American Planning Association awarded its 2015 Best Implementation Award to LWWP.

Prior to moving to Idaho, Clare was the first Executive Director of Taos Land Trust,

New Mexico. Among dozens of projects, she co-led the conservation of the famed Taos Valley Overlook (TVO), a life goal, via \$14.5 million from the federal Land and Water Conservation Fund. TVO became part of the Rio Grande El Norte National Monument. Passionate about the need for a broad-based statewide land trust, Clare was Founding Executive Director of the New Mexico Land Conservancy.

Clare also consulted on strategic management, organizational development and cultural diversity. She was an author and project manager for The Promise of Diversity, eds., Elsie Cross et al. She introduced the case study method of management education to Thai university faculty, in Bangkok.

Clare holds a B.A. in economics with honors from Yale and an MBA from Stanford. She has traveled extensively, and enjoys mountains, sports, music, dancing, and spending time with her dogs.
