IWF is enlisting members who can give 2-3 hours per month for 4-5 months to provide mentoring to professional Ukrainian women who are currently displaced due to the war. It is a program developed by a current Fellow, Iryna Rubis, who was a successful entrepreneur in Ukraine and fled with her small children after losing everything. IWF provided her a full scholarship to become a Fellow.

We know how very busy everyone is, especially this time of year, but wanted to offer this worthwhile opportunity.

#### **Member Spotlight**



**Marcia Liebich** 

Marcia Liebich earned a B.A. degree in History and General Honors from Elmira College in 1964 where she was inducted into Phi Beta Kappa. She spent the next five years as a Navy wife and substitute teacher during the Vietnam War while her husband Don served in the U.S. nuclear submarine service based in Groton, CT. They returned to upstate New York where they raised two sons in the Capital District region near Albany. Marcia joined AAUW and soon afterwards heard a mentor of hers make an impassioned plea that "we cannot keep our children at home until they are adults and therefore, we must do all we can to better our community and the world." Her words made an impression. During their time in New York, Marcia served as a volunteer and ultimately president of the boards of a children's home, AAUW, the United Way, and Sunnyview Hospital and Rehabilitation Center. She served as President of the Elmira Alumni Association and on the Board of Trustees of Elmira College for more than 20 years. She served as the Executive Director of the Sunnyview Hospital Foundation from 1992-1996.

The Liebichs moved to Breckenridge, CO in 1996 after Don retired from Sysco Corporation, then to Hailey in late 2001 after both sons relocated to Boise and they became grandparents for the first of six times. Since Don's retirement, they have traveled extensively, especially in the Middle East doing humanitarian work and citizen diplomacy. Marcia was one of the founders of the Wood River Women's Foundation and served as President in 2012 and 2013 as well as serving as the original grants chairman for the first three years of its existence. She was a member of The Community Library Board of Trustees and on its Capital Campaign Cabinet. She is a leader of Stephen Ministry at St. Thomas Church and on the Outreach and Pastoral Care Committees. She was recognized as one of the Idaho Women of the Year in 2016. She has been listed in Who's Who of American Women since the early 1980s. She is a founding member of IWF of Idaho and served on the original Membership Committee. She is currently on the

Advisory Boards of the I Have A Dream Foundation and the Sun Valley Playwright's Residency and a member of Chapter CH, P.E.O. Best of all, she was a hockey mom of two boys, watching them play from the age of five through college! Now she is a loyal soccer and track grandma spectator!
