- Date, time, and location
- Technical needs

## **Member Spotlight**



**Theresa Grant-Narasimhan** 

Theresa Grant-Narasimhan is the Founder and Executive Director of Make A Difference (MAD) Now, an organization dedicated to providing quality educational opportunities and care to orphaned and disadvantaged youth. MAD has been reducing poverty by providing long-term education support to vulnerable children from primary school through college. Since its inception in 2008, MAD has impacted the lives of more than 50,000 people in Zambia, Haiti, India, Syria, Guatemala, and Tanzania. Grant-Narasimhan oversees MAD's global operations. She has extensive experience managing international staff, board of directors, advisors, interns, and volunteers as well as sponsorship programs, charity climbs, and corporate social responsibility events.

Prior to founding MAD, Grant-Narasimhan worked with high-tech companies in Silicon Valley helping them with marketing. She has experience creating marketing plans, editorial calendars, press conferences, trade shows, press releases, and advertisements. Grant-Narasimhan holds a combined Bachelor's of Science in International Relations and Bachelor's of Arts in Spanish from Boise State University as well as an Executive Certificate in Leading Successful Social Programs from Harvard University, John F. Kennedy School of Government and a Management and Leadership Executive Certificate from MIT. She has been serving on boards and volunteering since she was in high school. Her first board she served on was the Environmental Resource Center Board of Directors in Sun Valley, Idaho and the first nonprofit she co-founded was Students for the Earth in Hailey, Idaho, where she was born. Grant-Narasimhan currently resides in Boise, Idaho.

Since having her two boys, Winston who is 3 and Henry who is 7, Grant-Narasimhan has been extremely passionate about helping young women.

"Women are one of the most vulnerable and disadvantaged populations in the world, yet we are often still the primary ones caring for our families. The more we can help empower women with skillsets, especially digitally, the more they will earn. Increased financial earnings lead to better decisions," Grant-Narasimhan said.

In line with their mission of providing quality education to vulnerable youth, MAD offers scholarships to young women to attend workshops delivering a curriculum in digital marketing and business planning for free. In return, the young women apply the skills they learn during the program to help small businesses in their local community, which are also owned and operated by women. This not only helps empower the young women but also their communities.

Grant-Narasiman invites IWFI members to the Kilimanjaro Region of Tanzania to see their Business Empowerment (BE) Program in action and go on a sustainable safari.
