Dear IWFI members:

A special wish to our members for a happy Mother's Day, rapidly approaching on May 14th. Mother's Day has its roots in Civil War efforts by mothers to use the power of motherhood to lower infant mortality, promote peace and appease tension. Ann Reeves Jarvis organized the first "Mother's Friendship Day" in 1868.

Following in her mother's footsteps, Jarvis organized the first official Mother's Day celebration at St. Andrew's Methodist Church in Grafton, West Virginia on May 10, 1908. Jarvis thought that women often went unnoticed and should be honored for their sacrifices for their families and country. Following this event, a familiar story unfolded where many women used their tenacity and networks including social clubs, churches, and letterwriting advocacy to make the case for national recognition. President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation on May 9, 1914, establishing the first national Mother's Day holiday to celebrate and revere American mothers.

Anniversaries and commemorations help us to reflect, remember and act.

2023 is IWF of Idaho's 10th anniversary as an organization. I hope to see you at our inspiring upcoming opportunities to *Learn, Mentor, Support, and Connect*.

March 20-21, 2023 Washington, DC

IWF began its 50th year of "Women Changing the World" by hosting the first-ever "Visionary Leaders Celebration" in Washington, DC amid the blooming cherry blossoms. Invitations were received by all Chapter Presidents, current and past IWF Global Presidents and Boards of Directors, and other women who have volunteered their time and talents to IWF Global to chair committees and to contribute financially to the mission of IWF. Approximately 100 women attended the event at the historic Willard Hotel.

After the Opening Reception, the program began the following morning as we were welcomed by Carolyn Carter, IWF Global President, IWF-NY. The first presentation, "Risk in the Virtual World", featured Pamela Passman, APCOs Worldwide Chair and a member

of IWF-DC. She was joined by Lauren Van Wazer, VP for Global Public Policy and Regulatory Affairs of Akamai Technologies, also a member of IWF-DC. Their presentation focused on the increasing risks in our virtual world and the many actions being undertaken to provide protection.

Then the Honorable Susan Rice, Domestic Policy Advisor to President Biden, former US Permanent Representative to the United Nations, and National Security Advisor to the President, was interviewed by IWF CEO Stephanie O'Keefe on the topic of "Advancing Women's Leadership-Where We've Been, Where We Are, and What Lies Ahead". Ms. Rice began her remarks sharing the inspiring story of the impact her parents had on her and their large family; her parents emphasized hard work, strong moral values in addition to the importance of education and giving back to the community. Ms. Rice then spent the remaining time sharing her experiences in both domestic and international affairs over several decades.

"The Nexus of Policy, Power, and Money" was presented by the Honorable Henrietta Holsman Fore, Chairman and CEO, of Holsman International and former Executive Director of UNICEF (member IWF-DC) with Betsy Fischer Martin, Executive Director of the Women & Politics Institute, American University (member IWF-DC).





At lunch The Presidents' Panel, four previous IWF Global Presidents, shared their unique perspectives on the past 49 years of the International Women's Forum and their dreams for our next 50 years.

We then had the unique experience of a "Behind the Scenes" tour of the John F. Kennedy

Center for the Performing Arts, hosted by IWF member and Deborah Rutter. This almost three-hour VIP tour was a highlight of the event!

Finally, our agenda concluded with "Diplomatic Dine-Arounds", a twist on the iconic IWF dine-arounds—each held in the home of an ambassador to the United States. These small groups had the opportunity to hear about the careers of these inspiring women diplomats and the challenges they face in their home countries.

The Visionary Leaders Celebration was an inspiring experience surrounded by IWF sisters from across the globe!

Member Spotlight



Nancy Hughes

Nancy Hughes is a graduate of Whitman College, the mother of three, and the grandmother of four. Prior to establishing <u>StoveTeam International</u>, she was a stay-at-home mom.

In 2003, while participating in a medical mission in Guatemala, she met Irma, a young woman whose hands had been burned shut after falling into an open cooking fire. Wanting to help, she started a small Rotary Club project that morphed into an effective international charity that has helped develop local factories to produce life-saving, fuel-efficient cookstoves in the developing world.

The Ecocina stoves, designed by StoveTeam, reduce wood usage by 50% and carbon emissions and particulate matter by over 86%. They reduce both burns and respiratory illnesses.

In the 20 years since StoveTeam International's inception, the stoves have improved the lives of more than half a million individuals in Guatemala, El Salvador, Honduras, Nicaragua and Mexico. Nancy is a CNN Hero, a Rotary White House Champion of Change, the recipient of the Bending Toward Justice Award, a Whitman Alumna of Merit, a member of both the Oregon and Idaho International Women's Forums and a recipient of the Atlantic Philanthropies' International Purpose Prize, awarded to individuals over 60 who have made a difference in the world. For her work establishing StoveTeam she was one of only 100 in the world to receive the 2009 Rotary Service Above Self Award.

Her work has been featured in National Geographic, the Rotarian, Forbes, and on PBS Newshour. The factories she helped start in Guatemala, El Salvador, Nicaragua, Mexico and Honduras have produced and distributed more than 82,000 stoves, improving the lives of more than half a million individuals.
