

Muffy Davis to be Honored with Statue along the Row of Champions



A bronze sculpture of IWF-Idaho's Muffy Davis will be unveiled on Wednesday, Oct. 4, at Festival Meadows in Sun Valley. The unveiling will take place between 5:30 and 7 p.m. along the Row of Champions on Sun Valley Road followed by a reception. Speakers will include Brian Barsotti, who kickstarted the project honoring Sun Valley's female Olympic medalists; Sun Valley Mayor Peter Hendricks, sculptor Benjamin Victor and Muffy Davis.

The local publication "Eye on Sun Valley" reports <u>here</u> that Muffy, a seven-time Paralympic medalist in two sports, shared, "I am immensely honored to be recognized in such a way and hope that through these beautiful sculptures we inspire the future generation of courageous female athletes and leaders."

Muffy Davis was a fierce competitor on the Sun Valley Ski Education Foundation's alpine team when she was paralyzed in a downhill training accident at 16. A Standford University graduate, she was inspired to begin racing competitively again after seeing the success of Picabo Street, whom she had raced against as a youngster. She went on to win three silver and one bronze ski medals in the 1998 and 2002 Winter Paralympics in Nagano, Japan, and Salt Lake City. And she dominated the London Paralympic Games Road Cycling

competitions in 2012, winning three gold medals which earned her a Guinness World Record for the most gold medals won in road cycling at a Paralympic Games.

She was the 2002 World Champion in Giant Slalom, a nine-time UCI Para-Cycling World Cup gold medalist and a three-time UCI Para-Cycling World Championships silver medalist. She was inducted into the 2022 class of the U.S. Olympic and Paralympic Hall of Fame.

She also is a member of the U.S. Ski and Snowboard Hall of Fame, a 2004 International Olympic Committee Presidents Disabled Athlete Award winner, and the 2002 Endurance Sports Disabled Athlete of the Year. Muffy has stayed involved with the Olympics and Paralympics movement as an elected member of the International Paralympic Committee's Governing Board, the United States Olympic Committee's Paralympic Advisory Committee and the Los Angeles 2028 board.

After serving in the Idaho legislature, she took her place as a Blaine County commissioner where she currently serves as chairperson.

We continue to thank outgoing Governance Chair, Jane Conard; Secretary/Treasurer, Randi McDermott; and Treasurer, Carolyn Lister for their service, skill, and commitment to advancing the best practices of our organization. Read more about these incredible women below.

### **Jane Conard**



Jane Conard is on the Sun Valley City Council, and is a health law consultant, mediator, and arbitrator. She worked with government healthcare agencies and with Intermountain Helathcare for 26 years before developing her own private practice, and she does volunteers arbitration in the Blaine County small claims court. She has lectured and provided courses for the American Health Lawyers Association (AHLA) and the American Bar Association. She served as chair of the AHLA In-House Counsel Section, as a member of the AHLA Board of Directors, and in 2016 was selected as a Fellow of the AHLA (a designation limited to about 150 lawyers). Jane was an adjunct professor at the University of Utah law school and the president of the Salt Lake County Bar Association and Women Lawyers of Utah (which selected her as the 2006 Utah Woman Lawyer of the Year). She is a member of the state bars of California, Utah, and Idaho. She received her a B.A. magna cum laude with honors from Macalester College, an M.A. with published thesis from the University of Iowa, and a J.D. from U.C., Davis, King Hall School of Law.

## **Randi McDermott**



Randi has served public education in Idaho for nearly 30 years and counting. She began her career with the Idaho State Board of Education, where she ultimately oversaw their policy, planning and government relations efforts. She spent 19 years with Boise State, serving as Chief of Staff and Vice President for Operations, and is proud to have been a member of the leadership team that saw the University transform into a doctoral research university with a reputation for creativity, innovation and record-breaking enrollment, retention and graduates. She is currently splitting her time serving as Chief of Staff at the College of Western Idaho and as proprietor at Ellie Mental Health Northwest Boise, which aims to decrease the stigma and fill the gap in mental health services in the Treasure Valley community. She holds a bachelor's degree in political science and a master's degree in public administration, both from Boise State University. She has enjoyed volunteer opportunities with the Boise City Club, Girl Scouts of the Silver Sage, North Boise Little League, YMCA, the Idaho Humane Society and Fuzzy Pawz Rescue. Randi is also a proud Mom, spouse, and a humble servant to three very spoiled pups. She enjoys live music, skiing, camping, reading, and especially, walking the trails of Idaho with any dog who wants to come along.

## **Carolyn Lister**



Carolyn grew up in L.A. and moved to Ketchum in the 1980s. Carolyn taught herself computer coding and developed the ambulance billing program for the City of Ketchum, became a firefighter and an advanced EMT when women were not welcome in these services, and obtained a 501(c)(3) status for the Ketchum Sun Valley Volunteer Firefighter Association. Carolyn served on the board of this charity and donated bookkeeping services. Carolyn began working for a private client handling large assets worldwide, and was eventually promoted into an Accounting position. The non-profits ERC and The Sawtooth Botanical Garden grew out of that organization while Carolyn was on staff. In the mid 90s, Carolyn became the Chief Financial Officer. In 2006, Carolyn created Sage Bookkeeping Inc. to provide the community with a consistent and standardized bookkeeping service. Carolyn grew this company from 1 employee and a handful of clients to 10 employees and over 200 clients across the nation, and is currently the largest service in Idaho. Carolyn teaches bookkeeping classes and provides continuing education and consulting for other bookkeepers.
