2023 World Leadership Conference and Gala

IWFI members who attended the conference in Detroit share their experiences below.



On October 4, 2023, I had the privilege of representing Idaho at the IWF President's Council meeting. This gathering brought together the IWF Board and over 60 Presidents of local chapters from around the globe. Traditionally, this meeting encompasses a comprehensive leadership report that outlines IWF's financial status and strategic undertakings. It also includes presentations of best practices, success stories, and roundtable discussions where intimate group conversations offer deeper insights into specific topics. I was invited by the President's Council Chair, Ruveni Kelleher, and I was truly honored to lead one of the six Challenge Roundtable discussions, which centered on Membership.

A significant highlight of the meeting was a presentation of findings from the 2023 Global Membership Survey. The purpose of the study is to inform 2024 strategic planning initiatives, capture member demographics, define the most valued benefits, and understand generational and regional differences. The study was done by Ellen Sills-Levy, Founder and Chief Insights Officer, ESL Insights. She is a member of the Women's Forum of New York.

Once the study is released, we will make sure to furnish our members with a link to the complete dataset. I believe you will all find compelling reasons for joining and remaining as IWF members, along with some intriguing general demographic information.

Reasons for joining:

Across all generations, the most common reason for initially joining IWF is to be part of a group of top women leaders from diverse professions. Having access to a global network of top women leaders and forming friendships within a leadership peer group rank second and third for all groups.

Reasons for staying:

- Being part of a group of top women leaders from diverse professions is also the top reason for continuing membership. Advancing women's leadership is one of the top 3 reasons.
- Forming friendships within a leadership peer group increases in importance as members get older.
- To have access to a global network of top women leaders and new perspectives on professional or personal issues for women round out the Top 5.

General information:

- 2202 members completed the survey: with a participation rate of 29%*
 * The percentage of responses from the US (61%) is consistent with the composition of IWF membership (63%)
- 74% are in senior leadership roles
- 40% of IWF members are in C-Suite positions holding a broad spectrum of senior industry positions
- Members are highly educated
- Members are affluent representing significant purchasing power
- Members are professionally diverse
- · Racial and ethnic diversity is increasing
- The IWF is attracting younger members

IWF of Idaho will be updating its strategic plan in the spring of 2024 and plans to use the 2023 Global Membership Survey data along with our own IWFI surveys to ensure our Idaho members find the most relevance and value in their IWFI experience.

I visited the Opera House in the heart of town, The interior has that old traditional feeling, it is a beautiful setting to enjoy any opera. You can then walk across the street and watch baseball after. Gala night was magical, hearing Motown tunes that reminded me of my teen years as I watched overlapping generations dancing the night away!

The absolute highlight of the conference was hearing the two Hall of Fame Inductees speak, they were so inspiring and touched us all with their achievements.

The speakers, programs, the gala, tours, receptions, and dine a rounds were interesting and well executed. The bus drivers and staff were friendly and focused on their role.

All the local people that I met were welcoming. Kudos to the Detroit Forum, they executed a great conference, in a city that they are very proud to call home.



How exciting it was to be one of 700 women from across the globe gathering in Detroit for the 2023 World Leadership Conference! We all know the dark history of Detroit's bankruptcy in 2013—the largest municipal bankruptcy in US history—the population then plummeted with the highest unemployment rate in the country. Such a sad history! But our IWF sisters in the Michigan chapter introduced attendees to the inspiring stories of leaders who would not let their city die and re-built it into a vibrant, growing city.

For me, as the chair of the Leadership Fellows Program Selection Sub-committee, the highlight of the conference was spending time getting to know these extraordinary young leaders beginning their journey together as the newest cohort. A few I will mention are the founder & president of the Institute of Peace & Diplomatic Studies in Pakistan, the Artemis Launch Director at NASA, the CEO of Edelman Canada, the Deputy Director of EHealth Development in Ukraine, and the Director General of the Canadian Armed Forces. All 40 women are already extremely accomplished in their fields but looking to take their leadership expertise to even higher levels through the Leadership Fellows Program. They inspire me!

I have never been to Detroit and had been looking forward to seeing its revitalization since the conference was announced pre-Covid. What I was able to see and experience was even more inspiring than I imagined. Even before the conference opened, Evelyn Self and I organized a day to find out What's Happening, beginning with a wonderful tour of the Motown Museum. We must have spent over 2 hours exploring the rich history and also learning how to dance like The Temptations. This was followed by an auto tour of Belle Isle with a wonderful Uber driver. Connected to the Detroit waterfront by a bridge, it is a huge nature park. Looking through a reedy marsh filled with wildlife, we were impressed by the Detroit skyline: rather than a view of wall to wall skyscrapers, there is open air between buildings and buildings of human scale. Back across the bridge, a new river walk has replaced what had been dockland and warehouses. Trees and sculptures are everywhere. We learned later, during the conference how a strong sense of community and public input was able to bring off what was already impressive, but was still a work in progress.

Setting the tone was an outstanding opening speaker—the Governor of Michigan, the dynamic Gretchen Whitmer. She set a high bar, but everything that followed met it. My "Behind the Scenes" was a tour of street murals, many financed by the city to bring color and vitality to the streets. Because these murals are spread across a wide area, I was able to see much of the areas in which abandoned houses had been reclaimed and renovated. The houses that can't be reclaimed have been removed and pocket parks with grass and trees are everywhere.

In short, this was one of the best IWF Conferences I have ever attended—and certainly the most inspiring in seeing what a community can do when it comes together on all levels.
