Recognizing Dr. Carol MacGregor



Dear IWF of Idaho Members:

Please join me in recognizing Dr. Carol MacGregor for thirty-two years of membership in IWF.

Carol hails from Idaho, where she spent her formative years and developed into a dynamic leader with a diverse professional background in academia and private business.

Carol's educational journey took her from public schools in Boise to Wellesley College and the University of California at Berkeley for her undergraduate studies. She pursued graduate degrees at Georgetown and Boise State University (BSU), culminating in a Ph.D. in History from the University of New Mexico.



Between 1970 and 2005, Carol served as an adjunct professor at BSU in the History, Political Science, and English departments. A prolific writer, teacher, and lecturer specializing in the history of the American West, she authored several books and articles, notably:

- The Journals of Patrick Gass: Member of the Lewis and Clark Expedition, Mountain Press (Missoula, MT), 1997, 5th edition, 2003.
- Shoshoni Pony, Caxton Press (Caldwell, ID), 2003.
- Lewis and Clark's Bittersweet Crossing, Caxton Press (Caldwell, ID), 2004.
- Boise, Idaho 1882-1910 Prosperity in Isolation, Mountain Press Pub., 2006.

Growing up in an entrepreneurial family, Carol began a business career early, displaying acumen in stocks, bonds, land, and horses. In a traditionally male-dominated field, she

stands out as a successful businesswoman, owning and operating the Belvidere and Raspberry Ranches in Cascade and the Picket Pasture Ranch in Emmett, managing over 1,000 acres of rangeland in Gem and Valley Counties.



Carol's commitment to philanthropy and community enhancement has been evident from a young age. She co-founded the Lillian Valley School for Shoshoni and Bannock children and initiated the Single Parent Scholarship in the BSU Humanities department. Her extensive board and community service include contributions to the College of Idaho, the Boise Art Museum, St. Alphonsus Hospital, and the Idaho State Historical Society (ISHS).

A consummate historian, Carol has championed many legacies for Idahoans and our great state. She restored the 1891 C. W. Moore home on Warm Springs Avenue, recognized by the National Register of Historic Places as the first geothermally heated home in America.

She played a pivotal role in the reimagining of the Idaho State Museum, which opened in 2019 and stands as a testament to her dedication to preserving Idaho's history. Carol envisioned her namesake gallery, the Treasures of Idaho, which features historic dress and artifact-based exhibitions, providing public access to unique and significant collections of the ISHS.



Innovative in her approach to public education, Carol supported the creation of monumental bronze art pieces, including Doug Hyde's "Hospitality of the Nez Perce" near the Idaho Capitol and the "Spirit of Idaho Women" suffrage centennial effort led by the Foundation for Idaho History.

Her passion for historic dress and fashion led to developing the "Defining Style: Western Heritage Through Fashion" digital initiative at ISHS, sharing the stories of over 350 historic textiles and costumes with a global audience.

Carol, while you are formally leaving IWF of Idaho as an active member, we will remember you as a true exemplar of leadership, embodying a legacy that spans history, the arts, business, the environment, and academia.

Dine-A-Rounds

This IWF tradition is a major reason why a lot of members across the globe feel these informal events make their membership worthwhile—and equal in weight to the opportunity to attend National and International Conferences.

IWF-Idaho has expanded during the Covid years, where there was no opportunity for in person fellowship. And we have expanded even more these last two years. I feel it is time to explain to our newer members, as well as to remind our long-standing members, of the worldwide enthusiasm for Dine-A-Rounds; in fact, many of our members who have attended the national and international conferences consider their Dine-A-Round one of the outstanding features of their Conference experience.

I want to be sure all members know how varied and creative a Dine-Around can be:

A Dine-A-Round can be 6 people—it doesn't have to be a larger group if someone has a small space.

A host does not have to assume all costs. Attendees can be asked to pay a certain price, to bring a dish, be given a choice of what type of dish, or to BYOB. Of course, hosts can underwrite the event themselves if they wish.

- Hosts may just offer a hearty appetizer buffet.
- Hosts may organize a Dutch treat at a local restaurant.
- The event could have a theme leading to lively discussion.
- The event could feature a speaker.
- Hosts can arrange a small dinner where everyone pitches in to learn how to cook their specialty dish.
- Members can co-host Dine-A-Rounds.

There are so many possibilities! All it takes is a little imagination of what is possible for you. If possible, if a host or attendee could over a potential guest from another town an overnight stay, it would also offer a wider opportunity for statewide fellowship.
